DATE OF INCIDENT: November 13, 2009

TIME OF INCIDENT: 11:00 a.m.

### DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT

A girls' PE class at Byng was on a trail run. One girl made a wrong turn and got lost. A man in his late 40s, sandy blond hair, with a mustache, light blue mini van stopped to talk to the girl and tried to offer her a ride. Teacher cars were behind him in an attempt to follow girls on the run and locate any lost girls. Man in the van saw the teacher cars and drove away. This incident happended on Imperial Road south of 16th avenue, close to Byng Secondary School.

A Safety Alert was distriburted to the school community on Friday, November 13 th at 1:00 p.m.

**Re: Expansion of H1N1 vaccinations to include school-aged children**

Dear Parent:

I am writing to advise that effective immediately, all students in Kindergarten through Grade 12 will be eligible to receive the H1N1 vaccine free of charge at community immunization clinics operated by Vancouver Coastal Health.

Drop-in immunization clinics are being held at the following three locations. Eligible individuals can also be immunized at their family doctor's office.

All clinics are on a drop-in basis. Expect line-ups outside. Dress warmly and bring an umbrella. **To help us serve you better:** Remember to wear short sleeves and bring your BC CareCard.

Elementary-school-aged children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian in order to provide consent. Secondary school students do not need to be accompanied by an adult. They will be immunized upon presentation, which is consistent with the provincial practice and BC laws on consent to treatment.

Vancouver Coastal Health has also worked with the Vancouver School Board to schedule a series of school-based immunization clinic starting Wednesday, November 18, 2009, at Vancouver Technical Secondary School. Vancouver students may attend any of the school-based clinics. Students do not need to be enrolled at the host school or be enrolled at one of the host school's feeder schools in order to attend.

At this writing, healthy adults aged 19-64 years old are **not** included in the population eligible to receive the H1N1 vaccine. Adults attending at these clinics must be a member of a previously or otherwise-announced eligible population in order to be immunized at these clinics.
